5.	What strategy does Anene use to make a fool out of Anansi?

6.	There is a common saying that goes, "You can never con an honest man." How does this saying apply to this story, particularly when looking at Anene's actions? How is Anene able to "con" Anansi?	
7.	The oral literature tradition consists largely of telling folk tales. Folk tales often aim to communicate moral values to a community of people, to promote one kind of behavior and condemn another kind of behavior. Why do you think so many cultures would rely on folk tales to communicate these values? What age group do you think could understand this story and its message?
