

SCIENCE FICTION BOOK PROJECTS

1. Interview a character from your book. Write at least ten questions that will give the character the opportunity to discuss his/her thoughts and feelings about his/her role in the story. This interview should be at least 500 words.
2. Write a diary that one of the story's main characters might have kept before, during, or after the book's events. Remember that the character's thoughts and feelings are very important in a diary. This diary should be at least 500 words.
3. Build a miniature stage setting of a scene in the book. Include a written explanation of the scene. The written explanation should be at least 250 words.
4. Write a feature article (with a headline) that tells the story of the book as it might be found on the front page of a newspaper. This feature article should be at least 500 words.
5. Write a letter to a character in your book asking questions, protesting a situation, and/or making a complaint and/or a suggestion. Then, write a letter in response from the character. You may write several letters back and forth if you wish. This should be at least 500 words total.
6. Write a FULL (physical, emotional, relational) description of three of the characters in the book. Draw a portrait to accompany each description. The writing portion should be at least 400 words.
7. Create a newspaper for your book. Summarize the plot in one article, cover the weather in another, do a feature story on one of the more interesting characters in another. Include an editorial and a collection of ads that would be pertinent to the story. The text of this newspaper should be at least 500 words in length.
